Dear Garden Club of New Jersey Members,

As gardeners, we are very aware of the changing seasons and extreme weather conditions. So, after a very wet summer, we are now experiencing a very dry autumn and as I write this message the 'Garden State' is under a drought watch. Let's please conserve our water use and when planning garden projects for next year, it is the perfect opportunity to expand the use of native plants in our planting repertoire.

Why natives? They are hardier, don't rely on fertilizers / pesticides to thrive and are tolerant to NJ's weather, including hot, cold, wet or dry conditions. They also benefit our local pollinators. Fall is the perfect time to incorporate native plants into the garden in anticipation of next summer's blooms.

The Garden Club of New Jersey (GCNJ) is also planning ahead. We will hold a virtual Fall Leadership Conference on September 30th for the Presidents of our federation of 100 local clubs. A Zoom link will be emailed to all Club Presidents who have submitted their email address to GCNJ's Membership Chair, Sue Berdahl. The theme of our meeting is "Strengthening Connections" through affiliation with GCNJ, the CAR (Central Atlantic Region) and NGC (National Garden Club).

Then, on October 22-23, the GCNJ will host the 2024 Central Atlantic Region (CAR) Conference at the Olde Mill Inn, Basking Ridge, NJ. Please check out the information in this newsletter and be sure to register to attend. Registration is open to all members of garden clubs affiliated with GCNJ.

Also, thank you to all the clubs that submitted Yearbooks to Awards Chair Peggy Morrissey. It is always wonderful to see the variety of programs and activities the clubs are offering. It is also time to begin spreading the word to students in your community about the GCNJ's Scholarships. Kathleen Mullarkey, Chair of the Scholarship Committee, looks forward to receiving applications again this year from numerous candidates with outstanding credentials. Lastly, please consider applying for a GCNJ Award or my President's Project ... Plant America: Gardening for a Healthy Mind, Body and Soul. Nancy Bigelsen: GCNJ Drumthwacket Chair, Garden Club of Mountain Lakes, District III

Last year, I became a CASA volunteer (Court Appointed Special Advocate) where I am assigned to a family of 2 children to monitor their well-being and report my findings to the court for the duration of their time in the DCPP system. It's been a privilege and an honor getting to know this family, understanding their challenges and watching them work to become the family they desire to be.

Over the years, I've also become very involved with the local and state garden clubs. My major roles in the Garden Club of Mountain Lakes, have been Drumthwacket chair for 12 years and President, 2011-2013 (and again next year). On the GCNJ Board, I have served as District 3 Director, a member of the Headquarters and Endowment Committee, and currently, as Chair of Drumthwacket. I love working with the GCNJ clubs for the unveiling of their holiday décor at the governor's mansion. So far, I've chaired Drumthwacket through two gubernatorial administrations and hope to be there for a third!

In our spare time, Steve and I enjoy spending time in NYC and traveling.

2023-2025 President Beverly Kazickas



President's Theme: Plant America - Gardening for a Healthy Mind, Body, and Soul

Description: Establish a program (or garden) that promotes and encourages the benefits of gardening to support physical and mental health.

GCNJ Affiliated Clubs in good standing will apply for a \$1,000 Grant in order to enact the aforementioned program (or garden). Three clubs will be selected per year for two years during 2024 and 2025. Total Grants will be \$6,000.

Gardening can act as a magic elixir for your Mind, Body, and Soul. Some of the benefits of establishing a President's Project in your community are:

MIND:

Gardening can be a stress reliever. Being out in nature is proven to improve your mood and create a feeling of peace. Research shows that the microorganisms in soil can help counteract depression and anxiety.

BODY:

The act of digging, planting, weeding, and watering is good for your body. Physical exertion can reduce health risks such as high blood pressure, heart disease, and osteoporosis. Gardening builds your strength and stamina while improving flexibility, coordination, and balance.

SOUL:

Gardening provides a sense of accomplishment and creates beauty to enjoy both as the gardener and for those in the community who view the results.
